Telephone directory

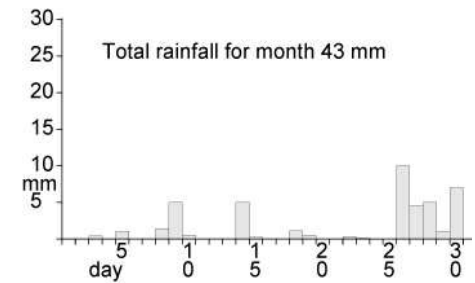
