This is not meant to worry you, but as a reminder to be ready. Climate change is causing surprisingly unfamiliar weather and many unexpected events, so what could happen here?

Electricity

We can have power cuts any time, but when snow and ice weigh down power lines they are more frequent.

Make sure you have some candles and spare batteries for torches. Central heating will not work even if you have oil. This is when a solid-fuel stove is useful.

For cooking, a camping gas ring is very valuable.

You can report a loss of power on 0800 66 88 77 or on 105.

Water

If water fails, ring 08451 242 424. The water board have been prompt in the past delivering a bowser and bottles.

If all else fails, you can use rain water if you boil it first.

Shopping

It is not unknown for the village to be cut off by snow drifts in both directions, accessible only by tractor or four-wheel drive. We always make sure we have a stock of tinned food and dry goods (rice, pasta etc) for just such an eventuality.

And finally

If such things do happen, this is a wonderful time for villagers to show community spirit by finding out how others are doing, and giving help when needed.


